Transition model for IFAGG Council positions

To apply, if changes to Statutes are approved in IFAGG GA 2022 and when Statutes are in force

- In ordinary GA 2023, when current president's and 3 Council members' terms are at end, president and five places are elected: president, three of Council members whose 2-year terms are at the end, and two additional members (so the total Council headcount is raised to 8 + president). Of the elected: President is elected for 4 years (for 2024-2027), and of the elected five Council members: 2 candidates getting the highest votes are elected for 4-year-term (for 2024-2027), the candidate with 3rd highest votes for 3-year term (for 2024-2026), the candidate with 4th most votes for 2-year-term (for 2024-2025) and candidate with 5th most votes for 1-year-term (for 2024).
- In 2024 (when 3 council members' terms are at end), 3 current members of the Council resign and the positions are open for election, as is also the position of council member who got lowest vote in 2023. Of the elected, the 2 candidates getting the highest votes are elected for 4-year-term (for 2025-2028), and candidate with the third-highest votes is elected for 2-year-term (for 2025-2026) and candidate with 4th highest votes is elected for 1-year-term (for 2025)
- In 2025, the council member who got second-lowest vote in 2023 and the council member who got lowest vote in 2024 are open for election /re-election. Of the elected, the 2 candidates getting the highest votes are elected for 4-year-term (for 2026-2029).
- In 2026, the council member who got third-lowest vote in 2023 and the council member who got second-lowest vote in 2024 are open for election /re-election. Of the elected, the 2 candidates getting the highest votes are elected for 4-year-term (for 2027-
- 2030).
- After 2026 the new routine is fully normalised, and only mid-term resignations give any cause to additional elections.
- All four-year-terms from 2023 onwards count toward re-election counts, but the transitional one or two or three-year-terms between 2023-2026 do not count toward re-election counts.
