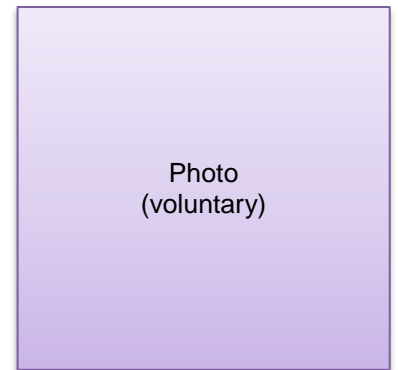

What will be the main challenges of IFAGG in the future (from your point of view)?

AGG sports discipline will be growing in the number of athletes representing this sport, and IFAGG will be growing in members, which are great opportunities for IFAGG to offer AGG discipline to the broader world of sports.

This will be challenging because it will require more responsibilities and professional skills from stakeholders: athletes, coaches, judges, and managers. The opportunity to be recognized by the IOC is another challenge that needs years of dedicated work.

Actions undertaken by IFAGG for the last two years exemplify how IFAGG is turning from an amateur organization to a professional one. They are full of meaning from the point of view of strategic decisions and operational steps.

Integrity, Inclusiveness, and Openness are the most valuable features of the IFAGG nowadays, which are more countable for me.

"Athletes first" needs a Code to help AGG gymnasts understand that they are protected by the federation now and after their sportive career ends. This contemporary approach will enable the federation to be fully aligned with the values of the IOC.
